AREZZO

Arezzo is a city with a very ancient history, one of the most important cities in the Etruria and a strategic place in Roman times. It reached its peak between the Middle Ages and the Renaissance. To this day, Arezzo has the relics of those times in its churches, palaces, monuments and museums where breathtaking masterpieces are kept and preserved. From the Basilica of st. Francis, with Piero della Francesca's frescoes, to the Cathedral; from Piazza Grande, with its Logge Vasari and the marvelous Fraternalita palace, to the Medici's Fortress and, lastly, the multitude of churches, among which there is San Domenico with the well-known Cimabue's Crucifix.

EXHIBITIONS AND EVENTS

GIOSTRA DEL SARACINO

An ancient knightly competition which consists of hitting a target placed on the shield of the Buratto (a revolving mechanism that represents the "Re delle Indie" / King of the Indies) with a spear, while racing towards it on horseback. It takes place every year in Piazza Grande. June and september

ON FOOT OR BY BIKE

IN THE FOOTSTEPS OF SAINT FRANCIS

"il Cammino delle Celle" (The Celle Walk), one of many Franciscan routes, is covered on foot and starts at the Santuario de La Verna and heads to the Church of San Francesco in Arezzo. It then continues to the Celle hermitage in Cortona and then to Assisi.

SENTIERO DELLA BONIFICA

Cycle and pedestrian path along the Maestro della Chiana canal that joins Arezzo and Chiusi with a route of about 62 +12 km. equipped and protected.

WALK AMONG THE GREENERY

PARCO IL PRATO

Historic park in the high part of the city between the cathedral and the Medici fortress.

PARCO PERTINI

Large park just outside the historic centre with routes equipped for physical exercise.

PARCO COLLE DEL PIONTA

Natural park and archaeological site where the ancient cathedral once stood. Adjacent to the university and the hospital area.

PARCO VILLA SEVERI

Park immersed in the surrounding nature just outside the city, in front of an ancient manor.

PARCO DUCCI

Park at the entrance to the city which houses the Jewish cemetery.

WHAT TO EAT

CROSTINI NERI

Ground veal, chicken livers, carrot, celery, parsley, capers, anchovies, extra virgin olive oil and 'vinsanto', a Tuscan dessert wine.

FEGATELLI

Pieces of pork liver "coated" (as Pietro Aretino called them in the 14th century) with pig's caul fat and seasoned with bay leaves, wild fennel, salt, pepper and extra virgin olive oil.

ACQUACOTTA

Sautéed onions, tomato and vegetable broth cooked for 30-40 minutes then beaten eggs are added. Eaten with toasted Tuscan bread.

CONIGLIO IN PORCHETTA

Rabbit stuffed with pancetta, potatoes, garlic, sage, rosemary and wild fennel then cooked in the oven. Ideal with potatoes.

MACCHERONI CON L'OCIO

In Arezzo "maccheroni" means large squares of fresh pasta about 7-10cm in length. Perfect with free-range local goose sauce.

BALDINO

Prepared with chestnut flour, sugar, raisins, pine nuts, walnuts, rosemary and extra virgin olive oil.

OUT OF CURIOSITY

LIFE IS BEAUTIFUL

The masterpiece film that won three Oscars by Tuscan director and actor Roberto Benigni was shot, for the most part, in Arezzo. Take a walk through the most picturesque streets and squares in the historic centre; it is possible to retrace the steps where the film was shot and to relive the same emotions.

THE TOFANO WELL

According to Aretine tradition, this is the well mentioned by Giovanni Boccaccio in the IV novel of the seventh day of Decameron, where there is a tale of a rich Aretine man called Tofano. He was a heavy drinker and the unfair jealous husband of beautiful Monna Ghita. The octagonal shaped sandstone well can be found towards the end of Via dell'Orto.

THE GNICCHE BANDIT

Regardless of the many crimes committed, several myths and rumours surrounding the figure of Gnicche (Federigo Bobini 1845-1871) were so widespread that for some, he became a hero who defended the weak and stole from the rich. His gestures were told of in country festivals in improvised chants with octave rhymes.
Borgunto, Colcitrone and Santa Croce.

5 THINGS YOU SHOULDN'T MISS

01. The Legend of the True Cross

Piero della Francesca's frescoes inspired by the *Legenda Aurea* (1205) written by bishop Jacopo da Varagine, narrated pictorially through 12 main episodes.

02. Piazza Grande

In the heart of the medieval city, the piazza displays buildings of different periods. Risen around 1200, it is characterized by the imposing Palazzo delle Logge built in 1573 and designed by Giorgio Vasari and the Palazzo di Fraternita. On the other sides, there are old wooden balcony houses and embattled towers.

03. Medici Fortress

(*Fortezza Medicea*)

A sample of defensive military architecture built following the drawings of Giuliano and Antonio da Sangallo between 1538 and 1560 under the orders of Cosimo I de' Medici. The ramparts of the Fortress constitute a panoramic point of the city, the Arno valley, the massiccio del Pratomagno and Alpe di Catenaiola.

04. Duomo

Cathedral of Saint Peter and Donato. Behind the altar, the Ark of Saint Donato, dating back to 1362. The facade rose window is a masterpiece by Guillaume de Marcillat. On the left side, the Chapel of Our Lady of Consolation and the fresco Saint Mary Magdalene by Piero della Francesca.

05. The Cimabue crucifix

Wooden crucifix painted with temperas and gold by Cimabue, dating back to 1268-1271.

MUSEUM HOUSE

06. Vasari House

The home of Giorgio Vasari celebrates his thought and art. The rooms are enriched by frescoes and a precious painting collection in the style of Mannerism. It is the highest expression of Italian artistic civilization of the 1500s.

07. Petrarca House

Inside, there is a vast library with hand bound medieval texts and precious antique editions. Important paintings and a rich numismatic collection.

08. Ivan Bruschi Antiquities Museum House

House of the founder of the Antique Fair hosting an eclectic collection. Precious archaeological finds, sculptures, paintings by great masters, ancient books and a prestigious numismatic section. In a 13th century palace with an intimate atmosphere, elegant aesthetic taste and beautiful panoramic terraces.

MUSEUMS

09. National Museum of Medieval and Modern Art

(*Museo d'Arte Medievale e Moderna*) Paintings, pottery and glass items of medieval and renaissance periods. Works by Giorgio Vasari, Spinello Aretino, Luca Signorelli, Andrea della Robbia.

10. Civic Gallery of Contemporary Art

It stores a permanent collection and organizes temporary exhibitions of artists of the 1900s and contemporary ones.

11. Museum of Fraternita and Gold Museum

The facade of the building was made following Giorgio Vasari's drawings; the clock displays lunar phases, the sun and earth. Inside, there is a permanent display of paintings, items and a splendid gallery of portraits. On the ground floor, there is the Gold Museum, unique pieces of golden artwork produced by painters, sculptors, designers and famous artists.

12. Means of Communication Museum

A history of communication with around 1000 pieces. There is pre-cinema, cinema, sound reproduction, telegraphy, writing, calculations... reaching up to modern technologies.

13. Museum of Giostra

"The colors of Giostra" is an interactive journey through 6 rooms where clothes, roles and characters come to life, transporting the visitor into a dimension frozen in time, thanks to interactive multimedia contents and the exhibition of historical costumes of the Giostra del Saracino.

14. Diocesan Museum

The museum exhibits works of art and liturgical material dating back to the XII-XIX centuries. Coming from the cathedral and churches of the diocese, they are significant due to the history and knowledge of the Aretine religious and artistic culture.

15. Gaius Cilnius Maecenas Archaeological Museum and Roman Amphitheatre

(*Museo Archeologico Gaio Cilnio Mecenate e Anfiteatro Romano*)

Near the remnants of the ancient Roman amphitheatre, it has 26 rooms with collections of pottery and jewelry of Etruscan and Roman periods.
